The Association has also been active in trying to clarify with RH Insurance what opportunities there are for young drivers to get insured.

Emma Airey, the head of RH has confirmed ERS' standard underwriting guidelines for the A7CA members who insure via the RH/A7CA scheme:

- Standard Minimum age (solo driving) is 21
- Minimum 1 year driving experience full UK licence
- Must be claim/conviction free
- Must have their own everyday vehicle and usage will be social, domestic and pleasure (no commuting).
- Drivers 17 20 Warranted Accompanied driving (ie not allowed to drive solo) to be added to an existing client's policy as a named 'Warranted Accompanied' driver via endorsement. Social, domestic & pleasure use only

Young driver excesses are as per policy wording.

Emma did add that she is willing to talk to members about the possibility of 'Solo' drivers being insured from the age of 19, but this would be on a case by case basis and cannot be guaranteed.

Drive-It-Day

Sunday April 21st 2024

We use yesterday's vehicles to support today's children.

National Drive It Day was created by the Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs in 2005. It is the occasion when historic vehicle enthusiasts and the public

at large have the opportunity to celebrate the One Thousand Mile Trial, from London to Edinburgh and back, organised in 1900 to prove the viability of the new invention, the motor vehicle.

It's also a chance to raise awareness and support amongst the public for the historic vehicle movement and keeping transport heritage on UK roads.

It sees clubs schedule regional and local events throughout the country on Sunday 21 April 2024. Importantly, it also raises funds for the NSPCC's Childline. Fundraising is an integrated part of 'Drive it Day', in which the historic vehicle movement comes together to contribute to a section of society that needs huge help and support – vulnerable children.

This money is raised by the purchase by drivers and riders of a fundraising 'Drive it Day' rally plaque. It's an easy way for drivers and riders to show their support, and donate vital funds.

Last year, a record £51,000 was raised and hopefully that can be beaten in 2024!

Below are details of just some of the events taking place in Devon this year:

North Devon Run.

Now in its 14th year the weekend has proved to be one of their most popular events with Vintage Vehicles, Motorcycles, Tractors, Caravans and Steam Engines, and in 2023, the event attracted over 2400 visitors a day. David's Diary

Having at last completed the replacement of the rear springs on 'Mabel', our 4 seat tourer, my attention turned to the job that I planned to do as soon as we returned from our tour round the S.W. Coast in the Autumn.

During the last few days of that trip, I became aware of a new noise which sounded like it was coming from the gearbox. I had also had to top up the gearbox oil during our journey, so I wondered if there had been an oil loss leading to a bearing failure. Not wanting to have the car off the road for too long, I planned to just swap the gearbox for the one that was sitting under the bench, which had come out of the RP which is under restoration. My thought was that as well as giving me the opportunity to look at Mabel's gearbox, it would be useful to know if the RP one worked or not, so spending a day or two doing the swap should be worth the time.

Of course, the swap took much longer than a day or two!! With the engine & gearbox out, several minor jobs that I had been putting off came to mind and to be fair were much easier to do with the engine on the bench.

One job was to cure the engine oil leaks which had been getting quite bad. I replaced the valve chest cover gasket and then dropped the sump and re-sealed that as well. To hopefully achieve a better long-term seal, I have used a very simple kit of pieces of flat bar in place of the standard oval washers. Time will tell if it is successful.



The kit is made up of 5 pieces of flat mild steel approx. 20mm wide and 2-3 mm thick drilled to match the holes in the sump. I bought the kit at an autojumble some time ago, but it would be quite easy to make one using the sump as a template.

With everything back together, and after a short test drive to the shops in Newton Abbot, Mabel was ready in time for our first 2024 event at the Agi in Brampford Speke and a few weeks later for a run around the Culm Valley Lanes and a very good lunch at The Culm Valley Inn. Thanks to Nick and Jude for their organisation.


